From the Pastor's Desk

Venerable Solanus Casey will be beatified on Saturday, November 18, Mass at Ford Field in Detroit. Fr. Solanus, a Capuchin priest died in 1957. Known for his great faith, attention to the sick, and ability as a spiritual counselor. Born on November 25, 1870 as Bernard Casey. He was the sixth child of 16 born to Irish immigrants in Wisconsin. At age 17 he left home to work at various jobs, including as a lumberjack, a hospital orderly, and a prison guard. Re-evaluating his life after witnessing a drunken sailor brutally stab a woman to death, he decided to act on a call he felt to enter the priesthood. Because of his lack of formal education, however, he struggled in the minor seminary, and was eventually encouraged to become a priest through a religious order rather than through the diocese.

In 1898, Fr. Solanus joined the Capuchin Franciscans in Detroit and after struggling through his studies, in 1904 was ordained a "sacerdos simplex" – a priest who can say Mass, but not publicly preach or hear confessions. During the course of his priestly ministry he was very close to the sick and was highly sought-after throughout his life, in part because of the many physical healings attributed to his blessings and intercession. He was a co-founder of Detroit's Capuchin Soup Kitchen in 1929. He faithfully served the people of Detroit, MI, Huntington, IN, New York City and Yonkers, NY by providing soup for the hungry, kind words for the troubled, and a healing touch for the ill. Wherever he served, people (Catholics and non-Catholics) would line up for blocks for a moment with Fr. Solanus.

For 21 years he was porter at St. Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit. As porter he met thousands of people from every age and walk of life. He earned recognition as "The Doorkeeper." He was always ready to listen to anyone at any time, day or night...and to encourage everyone to "thank God ahead of time." He is also known for his fondness for playing the violin and singing, although he had a bad singing voice because of a childhood illness which damaged his vocal chords. Even in his 70s, Fr. Solanus Casey remained very active, and would even join the younger religious men in a game of tennis or volleyball. He died from erysipelas, a skin disease, on July 31, 1957, at the age of 87.

Because of Fr. Solanus' holiness, Pope John Paul II declared him Venerable in 1995. A miracle attributed to Venerable Casey's intercession was recognized by Pope Francis on May 4, 2016. The upcoming beatification on November 18, will allow public veneration of him as being a saintly and holy person and with that he receives the title of "Blessed." With this declaration, he is acknowledged as one who is in heaven, and in union with God. Another approved miracle after that will advance the Cause finally to sainthood.

Fr. Solanus' holiness is inspiring. He had incredible faith and he was a holy man. Often, people think that holiness is unattainable. But Fr. Solanus demonstrated that an ordinary person can live an extraordinarily faithful life. Pilgrimages to the Solanus Casey Center lead the pilgrim to discover that we are all capable of living a faith-filled life.

On November 18, I will join a few from our parish and from the diocese in the Eucharistic celebration for the beatification of Fr. Solanus. The Faith Formation team will be organizing a pilgrimage to Blessed Solanus Casey Center and Soup Kitchen next year as part of our parish evangelization outreach. More information will be provided in the months ahead. A pilgrimage to the Solanus Casey Center is a trek to re-enforce or re-discover our faith and love for God.
